

2012 Scholarship Application

HISTORY

The Ohio Township Association (OTA) began offering scholarships in 2005, after a generous donation from past board member Paul Smith, and his wife Ethel. The scholarships are continually funded by donations from county township associations, personal donations and a percentage of OTA merchandise sold.

Three scholarships, in the amount of \$1,500 each, are awarded annually. Scholarships are given in two categories: Local Government Achievement and Academic Achievement.

Applicants must be high school seniors, reside in one of Ohio's 1,308 townships and must plan to attend a two or four-year Ohio college or university. Requirements include a completed application, 500-word essay, high school transcript and two letters of recommendation.



Muskingum University administers the OTA scholarship program. Applications must be postmarked by **January 27, 2012**. Finalists will be notified by March 30 and winners will be announced May 1.

REQUIREMENTS

All applicants must be U.S. citizens; be high school seniors during the 2011-2012 academic year; reside in an Ohio township; and, plan to attend an accredited two or four-year Ohio college or university in the fall. One Academic Achievement Scholarship will be awarded and two Local Government Achievement. Students are permitted to apply for both scholarships, however, two separate packets must be mailed, and they are only eligible to receive one.

Academic Achievement Scholarship

This scholarship is for students who have displayed above average levels of academic achievement. Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Have at least a B average (cumulative)
- Have at least a 22 ACT or 1000 SAT score

Local Government Achievement Scholarship

This scholarship will recognize outstanding and innovative leadership efforts with a school, group or club, informal network or organization. Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Demonstrate outstanding citizenship through service and participation in community activities

To apply, submit the following items to the address below.

1. Application Form
2. Statement of Activities, Honors, Leadership - list school and community activities, including years in which you participated. Identify leadership positions or awards you received.
3. Copy of Transcript
4. College Admission Test Scores
5. Two Letters of Recommendation - these should be submitted by teachers and/or community leaders.
6. Essay - an essay, no more than 500 words, on the importance of local government in Ohio for the Academic Achievement Scholarship, and detailing a community project or event you participated in that made an impact on your life for the Local Government Achievement Scholarship.

All of the above items must be mailed in one envelope by **January 27, 2012**, to the address below.
