Course Description:

This course trains key response personnel within a local jurisdiction who are required to prevent, mitigate, manage, and/or resolve a weapon of mass destruction (CBRNE)/terrorism incident. Participant learning occurs in multidiscipline teams. Upon course completion, these teams will be able to conduct a capabilities-based comprehensive CBRNE/terrorism risk (threat and vulnerability), capabilities, and needs (planning, organization, equipment, training and exercises) assessments.

Course Description Continued:

The course consists of lectures, small group discussions, participant activities, multi-media scenarios, and the conducting of vulnerability assessments for facilities, sites, and infrastructure selected by the host jurisdiction. Participant activities focus on the DHS Office of Grants and Training (G&T) State Homeland Security Assessment and strategy (SHSAS) Program's jurisdiction assessments, i.e., risk capabilities, and needs.
