2011 Scholarship Application



General Information

Purpose:

The Ohio Township Association is offering three \$1,500 scholarships to high school seniors in an effort to help further the education of students in Ohio.

Requirements:

To be considered for a scholarship, the applicant must be a U.S. citizen and reside in one of Ohio's 1,308 townships. They must submit the following to the address on the following page by Friday, Jan. 28, 2011.

- Completed scholarship application
- 500-word essay
- Copy of most recent high school transcript
- Copy of ACT and/or SAT scores; and
- Two letters of recommendation from teachers and/or community leaders

Scholarship Type:

Scholarships are offered in two categories. One Academic Achievement Scholarship will be awarded and two Local Government Achievement.

Academic Achievement Scholarship

This scholarship is for students who have displayed above average levels of academic achievement. Recipient will receive one-time award of \$1,500. Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be a high school senior during the 2010-2011 school year
- Have at least a B average (cumulative)
- Have at least a 22 ACT or 1000 SAT score
- Be a resident of a township in Ohio, and
- Plan to attend an accredited two or four-year Ohio college or university in the fall. The college or university must be a public or private institution from which you can earn an associate or bachelor's degree.

Local Government Achievement Scholarship

This scholarship will recognize outstanding and innovative leadership efforts with a school, group or club, informal network or organization. Recipient will receive one-time award of \$1,500. The applicant must meet the following requirements:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be a high senior during the 2010-2011 school year
- Demonstrate outstanding citizenship through service and participation in community activities
- Be a resident of a township in Ohio, and
- Plan to attend an accredited two or four-year Ohio college or university in the fall. The college or university must be a public or private institution from which you can earn an associate or bachelor's degree.

Deadline:

Completed applications must be received no later than Friday, Jan. 28, 2011. Finalists will be notified by March 30 and asked to take part in an interview. Scholarship winners will be notified by May 2. Recipients must provide proof of college or university acceptance prior to receipt of award. Scholarship money will be paid directly to each student's college or university for tuition and other educational expenses.



Scholarship Requirements

Application Materials:

To be accepted for judging, applicant must submit all required items in one package as listed below. Applicants are only eligible to receive one scholarship although they may apply for both. Winners of the Ohio Township Association 4-H Local Government Scholarship are not permitted to apply for these scholarships. If applying for both scholarships, two separate packets must be submitted. Incomplete application packages will be immediately disqualified from judging. Reference letters and transcripts may be submitted in individually sealed envelopes with the application package. The following items must be included to be considered:

- 1. Application Form**
- 2. Statement of Activities, Honors, Leadership** - On a single sheet of paper, list school and community activities, including years in which you participated. Identify leadership positions you held. List any honors or awards you received. Local Government Achievement Scholarship applicants must demonstrate outstanding citizenship through their service and participation in community activities.
- 3. Copy of Transcript** - High school transcript. Academic Achievement Scholarship applicants must have at least a B average (cumulative).
- 4. College Admission Composite Test Scores** - Applicants must have at least a 22 ACT or 1000 SAT score. A copy of all test results should be included.
- 5. Two Letters of Recommendation** - Applicants shall include two separate letters of recommendation from teachers and/or community leaders.
- 6. Applicant Statement** - An essay written by applicant, no more than 500 words, double-spaced, typewritten.
 - *Academic Achievement* - Describe the importance of local government in Ohio
 - *Local Government Achievement* - Describe a community project or event you participated in that made an impact on your life

Please read the application thoroughly for rules, eligibility, requirements and instructions. All of the above items must be mailed in one envelope and received no later than Friday, Jan. 28, 2011. Please mail to the following address.
